How It Works

For Young People

As they grow up, everyone can have problems with:

- school work
- attending school
- feeling unhappy or angry

The educational psychologist's job is to help schools, parents/carers and you to find answers to these problems, and to help you cope.



The Educational Psychology Service:

- helps a lot of young people
- works closely with schools
- links with other agencies such as health and social services



Educational Psychologists have skills and knowledge in:

- psychology, education and learning
- emotional development and behaviour

They can help by:

- attending your support meetings at school
- talking to your parent/carer and your school to find out why they think a psychologist could help
- meeting with you, on your own, to look at your work and talk to you
- finding out more about what you do best
- helping you to say what you think
